



INSTRUCTIONS FBFC143 – Free Standing Lace Pumpkin – for Angelina Fibers or Film, Organza or fabric applique.

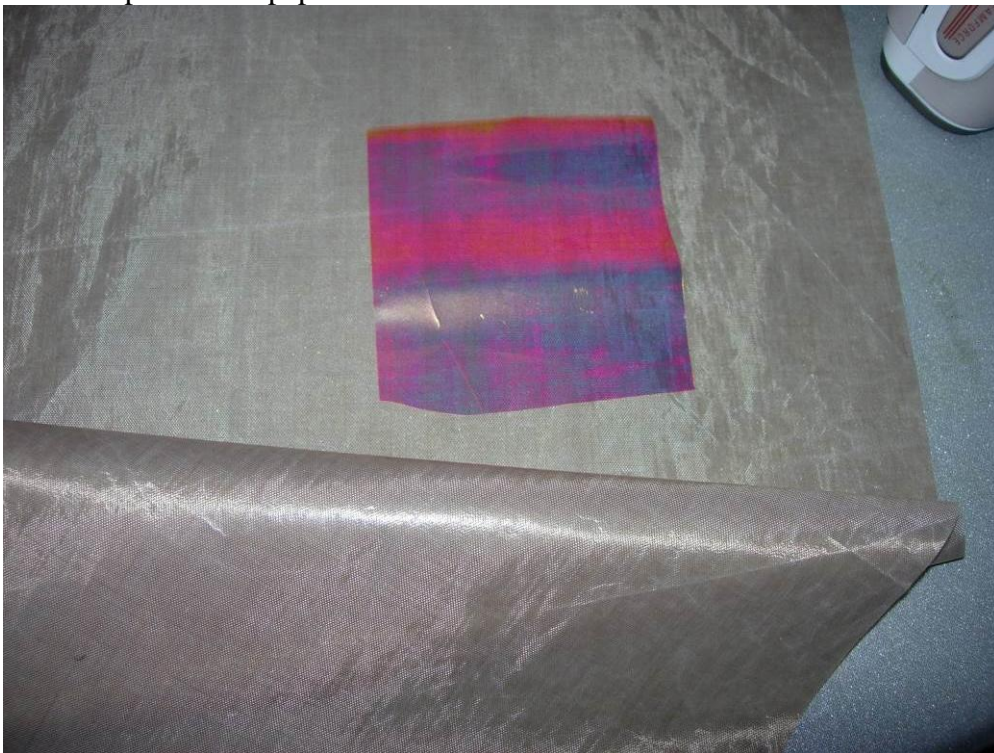
You can use this Pumpkin a lot of ways. I show it using Angelina Film and Fibers. You can also stitch it directly on organza (no need for stabilizer) and trim excess when done and use a hot tool to remove any bits around the edge. It will also work with fabric. This design fits a 4x4 hoop,

The stem has a hole so you can add a ribbon or other hangar. I used green ribbon.

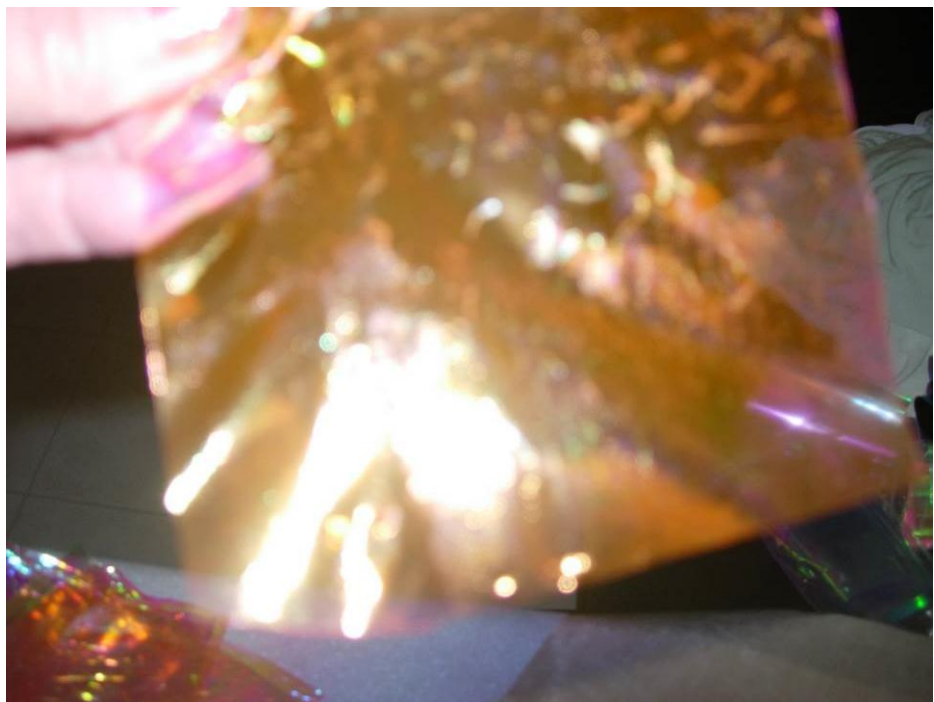
#### PREPARE ANGELINA FILM or FIBERS

You can use one layer of film, or use two and fuse them together to mix colors. I used Desert Sunset and Watermelon and Raspberry and Citronella to make an orange color.

Cut a piece of film large enough to cover your pumpkin. Either use it as is, or press it between two Teflon sheets or parchment paper.

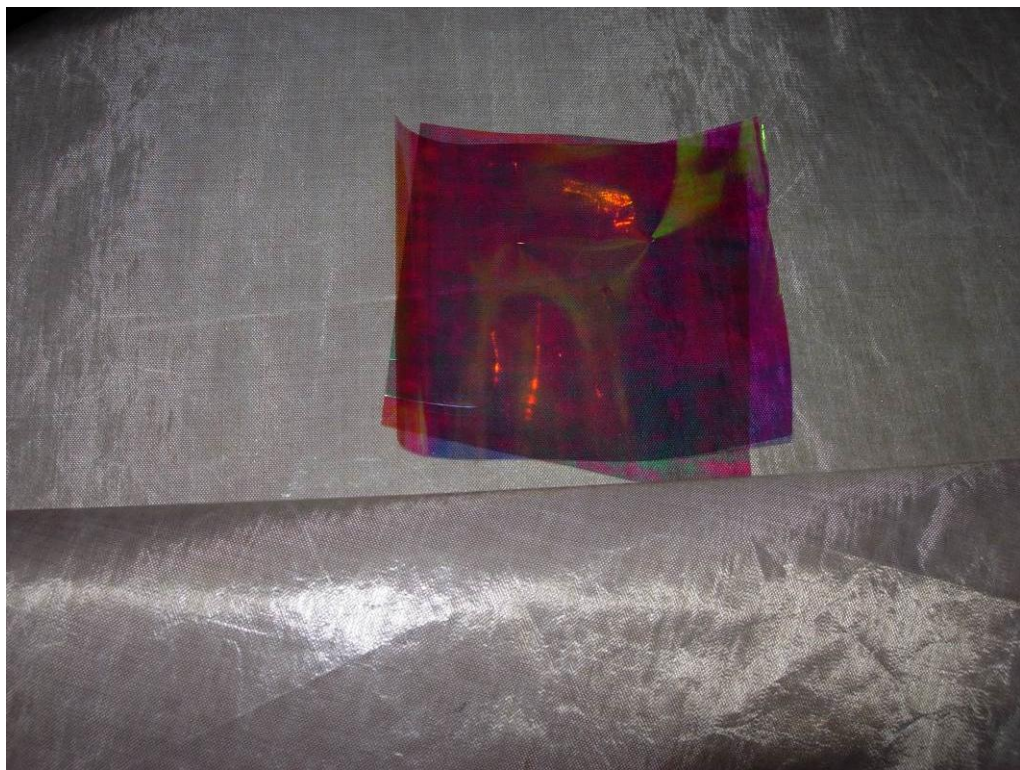


I press a single layer because it seems to accent the colors and also makes it a little firmer. Here it is after pressing:



As you can see it's very hard to get the right colors of Angelina with a camera! LOL

You can also cut two pieces of different colors and fuse together:



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I used Watermelon Angelina Fibers for one of the pumpkins. Spread out some of your fibers to the approximate size:



Cover and press.



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TO STITCH the Design  
Stitch Color Stop 1



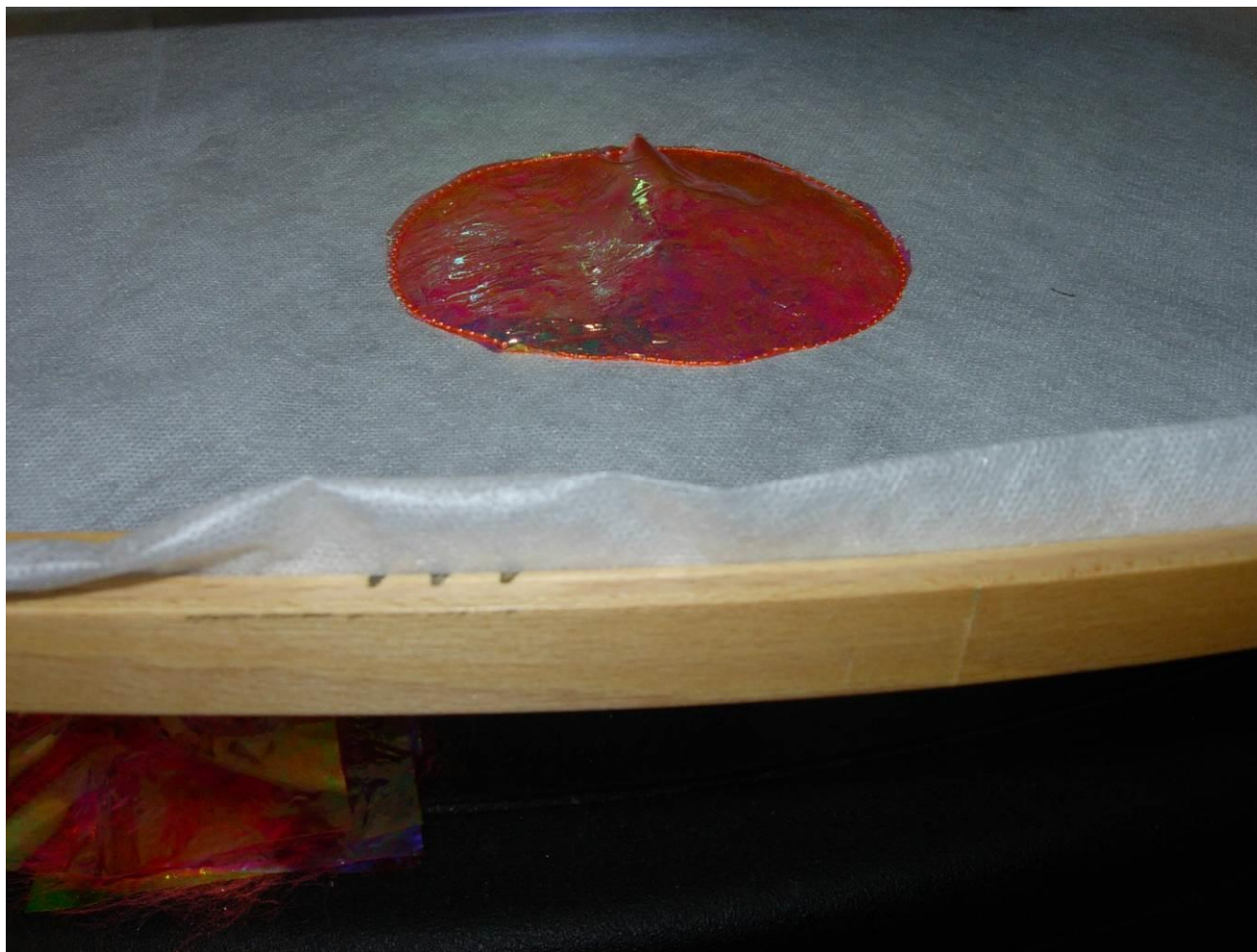
Lay your Film, Fibers, or fabric on top of the line. You can secure with tape or temporary spray. Stitch Basting 2.



Remove hoop from machine and trim the excess Angelina.

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Return to hoop and stitch the remainder of the design.

PLEASE NOTE: You can see that I have a wrinkle at the top of the pumpkin. I just held the film and this happened. At first I was going to do it again, but I thought I would see how it looked. The pumpkin came out cute – kind of has wrinkles. LOL I just wanted to show you that you don't always have to do things exactly perfect!
